

ENROLMENT SCHEME

HOME ZONE

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be entitled to enrol at the school. The the home zone is also shown on the attached map and found on the school website www.pnins.school.nz. Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

The Education Act gives a guarantee of enrolment to students who live in the home zone specified in the school's enrolment scheme. The board needs to be sure that an in-zone address is genuine, because it is required to manage the enrolment scheme for the benefit of local students.

The address given at the time of application for enrolment must be the student's usual place of residence when the school is open for instruction. This means that if you currently live at an in-zone address but move to an outof-zone address before your child's first day of attendance at the school, your child will not be entitled to enrol at the school.

URBAN AREA

The proposed Enrolment Scheme is the area enclosed as follows (both sides of roads and streets):

- · Dittmer Drive
- · Pitama Road
- · Newbury Street
- · Cardiff Street to Pioneer Highway to Lyndhurst Street; Lyndhurst Street
- Seddon Street to Tremaine Avenue; Tremaine Avenue to North Street; North Street
- · Elizabeth Street to Grey Street; Grey Street to Albert Street; Albert Street to Church Street; Church Street to Ruahine Street; down Ruahine Street following the city boundary
- Centennial Drive; following the Manawatu River to Dittmer Drive.

RURAL AREA

The proposed Enrolment Scheme is essentially the area within the City Boundaries on the eastern side of the Manawatu River. Following the Manawatu River to Gardeners Road across to North Range Road – South Range Road and follows the city boundary but excludes Linton Camp.

Note: Map of Home Zone must enable one to determine whether any particular address is in or out of zone.

Each year, application for enrolment in the following year will be sought from our Contributing Schools. Enrolment applications will be sought by the end of Term 3 so that the Board of Trustees can determine the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.



SPECIAL PROGRAMMES

The school operates the following special programme:

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Students who live within the school's home zone and meet the criteria for enrolment in the special programme will be enrolled ahead of out of zone students.

The criteria for acceptance into the programme are as follows:

- · Students must be Ongoing Resource Funded Students (ORRS) (Provision for up to 10 ORRS students).
- · If there are more than 10 applicants, then any out of zone applicants will be balloted.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS	
First Priority	must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education.*
Second Priority	must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
Third Priority	must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
Fourth Priority	must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
Fifth Priority	must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
Sixth priority	must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
