CELL PHONES




Students are **not permitted** to bring cellphones to school . Our school office phone is available up to 4.00pm for any **urgent** calls.

If it is necessary for your child to bring a cell phone to school then we require notification from parents. Parents need to email the principal on **principal@pnins.school.nz** if they have a medical or health and safety reason that necessitates them bringing a cellphone to school. These phones will be handed into their child's class teacher upon arrival at school in the morning. The cell phone can be collected at the end of the school day, at 3.10pm.

Any student found with a cell phone in their possession during school hours, will be required to take it to the school office for their parents to collect.

NEW UNIFORM



Just a reminder that students will all need a hat by next Monday - available for purchase via the school office or at Academy Apparel.

Sunsense - Hats & Sunscreen

Please encourage your child to use sunblock. Sunhats are compulsory and part of our school uniform from Labour Weekend through to Easter.

It is an expectation that all children wear the correct sunhat at interval, lunchtime and when outside participating in sports sessions.

The white or blue school sun hat with a brim provides the best protection, although, plain blue or white bucket hats are permitted. Available from our school office for \$12.

Sports caps are available to purchase from Academy Apparel that may be used during sports events and activities during lunchtime. However, the wide brim bucket hat is used otherwise.

For Specialist Technology Programmes, children are to **wear black lace up leather shoes** with school socks

(Note: these are not T-bar shoes, or canvas shoes).

This is due to Health & Safety requirements. Wearing sports shoes/ black slipper shoes are not acceptable.


OPPORTUNITIES AND EXPERIENCES

BYOD

PNINS's vision is to innovatively blend the use of technology into current programmes, while adapting current practice to include the use of devices. We encourage students to Bring their Own Devices to school and they can do so once their class has gone through the Safer Internet Day. All devices must be registered via our website

https://pnins.school.nz/byod - this includes those Year 8s who registered their devices last year, they will need to re register for the 2024 year.

There is no preference of the device - the following are the **recommended specs for the BYOD**:

- Devices are not to be smaller than an iPad mini.
- Must be able to run the latest Operating system.



If you are considering a Windows or Apple laptop:

- Must be running minimum Windows 10 or MacOS 10.14 (Mojave)
- Must have a SSD (Solid State Drive) and minimum 4GB Ram (8GB recommended)

Our preference is a Chromebook as the school uses Google for Education Apps. However, other devices suit as long as they meet the minimum requirements.

PERFORMING ARTS PROGRAMMES

As mentioned this will be done through the website and during the course of this term we will be running auditions for each of the four performing arts groups at PNINS. These groups are: Choir, Drama, Dance and Orchestra. While all students at PNINS are eligible to audition for these groups if they desire, we would like to take this opportunity to point out that not everyone will necessarily be accepted into these groups as places are limited due to size of available rehearsal venues as well as number restrictions placed on our Taradale School Performing Arts Exchange as well as Super Arts events.

There will however, be additional opportunities in some of the disciplines presented throughout the year, such as auditions for places in the school rock band which is a lunchtime based activity and this year's team assemblies.

HAIR EXPECTATIONS

Existing regulations relating to hair include: (as per School Prospectus)



Boys - Hair to be off the face and cut so it is off the shirt collar, and out of the eyes.

Girls – Hair to be off the face and, if long, to be tied back.

- No hair styles that are fashion statements eg beaded braids in hair, rats tails, Mullets, etc
- The student's natural hair colour only is permitted no dyes, highlights, streaks
- No hair gel, wax or similar hair product
- Only white or navy blue hair ties are to be worn

ABSENCES



We ask that you either give us advance warning via the school app or phone the school by 9.15am on the day of any absence.

To avoid the possibility of a missing child - when you think they're safe at school - while we assume that they must be with you - we phone home to check on any unexplained absence. Please ring us before we need to ring you to clarify why your child is absent.

DAILY SCHOOL TIMES 2024



For 2024 the school's daily times will be the same as last year, to maximise morning teaching/learning times.

The following will be our daily times in 2024:

Starting Time -8.45am

8.45am - 10.45am Teaching Block 1 -Morning interval -10.45am - 11.15am Teaching Block 2 -11.15am – 1.00pm Lunchtime -1.00pm - 1.55 pm Teaching Block 3 -2pm - 3.10pm

Note: The PNINS school day starts at 8.45am not at 9.00am like a number of primary schools.

It is an expectation that all PNINS students are at school by 8.30am to allow time to unpack their bags and ready themselves for learning at 8.45am.

If your child is late they must report to the school office with a note from their parent stating the reason for lateness.

SCHOOL DONATION/ **ACTIVITY FEE & STATIONERY FOR 2024**




A voluntary family donation of \$85.00 per child and in addition an Activity Fee Contribution of \$135.00. In total \$220 per child is requested.

The activity fee contribution pays for the materials children use in specialist technology rooms, IT consumables and resources, the range of extracurricular learning and cultural programmes that this school provides its students.

Although payment is voluntary we do urge you to pay. The Ministry grant is simply not enough to cover the funding of all that we offer at this school.

SCHOOL STATIONERY




As in the past, all students have been given a pack that includes all school stationery requirements your child will need. These are given to each child on day 1.


The cost per pack is \$35 and includes the Student Log Book, Clearfiles, portfolio clearfiles.etc.

Parents/caregivers who elect to pay the School Donation and Activity Fee Contribution by the end of Term 1, the stationery pack valued at \$35 will be free.

Note: To get this benefit both the school donation and activity fee must be paid together (\$220)

STUDENTS TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

The streets surrounding the school are extremely busy during peak traffic times.

CULTURAL GROUPS

SWIMMING - DRESS CODE

For 2024 the following dress code is required in our school pool.

- All swimwear must be made of swimwear material.
- No T-shirts, boxer shorts or underwear to be worn

Girls

- Modest one or two piece swimwear.
- If wearing a two piece no bikini (bra top) but instead a crop top can be worn.
- Swim shorts may be worn but should not reach below the knee.

Boys

Swim shorts **must have an inner lining**, and should not reach below the knee. No underpants or boxers are to be worn underneath swimming shorts.

The need for guidelines has been brought about by a number of students wearing inappropriate swimming attire in the school pool and is based on:

- Health and Hygiene concerns no boxers or street wear
- Need for modesty with an element of choice within the above guidelines
- **Filtration** concerns hair product / fibres blocking the system

YEAR 7 AND YEAR 8 IMMUNISATIONS



The year 7s will be offered both boostrix and HPV as we offered year 7s in 2023.

Therefore, the year 8s this year should have had opportunity for vaccination last year.

These are scheduled for Thursday 28th March and Wednesday 3 April 2024. Students will bring home either a Year 7 (dTap) immunisation or Year 8 (HPV)

Immunisation permission form as soon as we have them.

Te Whatu Ora

Are your child's immunisations up to date?

The School Based Vaccination Programme commences March 2024 Diphtheria Tetanus Acellular Pertussis (Boostrix) & HPV vaccinations will be offered at school, free and convenient.

We will be offering Boostrix and HPV to the year 7 students; these students will receive 2 vaccines on the same day. Students will receive their second dose of HPV 26 weeks later in the second round of vaccinations.

Round one of school immunisations will be taking place on 28th March and 3rd April

Your child will bring home a consent form (see photo) in their bag which outlines the two immunisations that will be administered.

When you receive a consent form for your child, watch the video clips with your child, read the information, sign, and return it to school even if you don't choose to vaccinate your child at school.
